So as a base we decided to use the March project money to relocate her closer to family on Samal Island. We built her a new house and helped her find income with chickens, goats, pigs and coconuts.



House still needs some more work done to it but Lache's Mum is delighted.

Goat House, Metal Frame and New Grow Bed

Finding alternate sources of income for the orphanage and our base have become a priority. We have personally purchased four goats to start our goat dairy. We used the April project funding to build a goat house. These goats will help to supplement the diet and hopefully as the number increases there will be an income from selling the milk.

Additionally we have had to make some modifications to our aquaponics experiment. We have recently applied to AusAid for recognition of this project and potential funding for major expansion and multiplication. A metal frame was created due to a termite attack and a new grow bed was made due to requiring a level of excellence to create an entirely waterproof bed that would last for the long term.

We have created a new design that will hold the fish tank directly underneath to work more effectively in high density urban poor areas – like where Family Circus works.

Furniture, supplies and uniforms for CHOSEN

The Healing Room classroom now has 6 student desks, 2 teachers desks and 8 chairs, a whiteboard, two fans and a craft table.
